WEOKIE Foundation Scholarship Essay is due February 29, 2012. Scholarships will be selected in early April 2012. This is a \$1000 scholarship. Applications are available in the Scholarship File.

Oklahoma's Promise (formerly called OHLAP) is a tuition waiver program for students whose family income is under \$50,000. Application must be made prior to June 30 of the sophomore year. Applications are online at the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education website www.okpromise.org. For questions call 800-858-1840. Seniors who applied prior to June 30 of the sophomore year should check with their counselor to ensure all course requirements are being met.

It's never too early to begin thinking about financial aid for college. Seniors and their parents must apply for FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) as soon after January 1, 2012 as possible. This application will help determine if you qualify for grants (free money) and will help the colleges to which you apply determine a financial package for you. Income tax returns do not have to be filed prior to submitting the application, but the income information must be entered on the application. The website is www.fafsa.ed.gov. CAUTION: Do not do a Google for FAFSA as there are some websites that may pop up that will charge you to enter the information on the free application!
