

### Rules Relating to Raffles

- 1.) The issuance of each raffle ticket is final and there shall be no refunds.
- 2.) Tickets, ticket stub receipts and the winner's rights are not transferable.
- 3.) Due to postal regulations, raffle ticket stubs cannot be returned by mail for voluntary contributions over the Internet, through the mail, or by telephone. When a voluntary contribution is made, the ticket stub must be completed with the name, address and phone number of the donor.
- 4.) If not present, the winner will be notified by telephone and certified mail within 48 hours of the drawing at the telephone number or address provided to the (Name of Organization).
- 5.) Winner must produce a ticket with corresponding number to the ticket stub drawn as well as two forms of identification with a social security number.
- 6.) Winner has ten days to (accept the prize) or forfeits all claims thereto.
- 7.) At the drawing, five ticket stubs will be drawn from the raffle box by and under the supervision of the (organization). Those five raffle numbers will be assigned a number from one through five according to the order they were drawn.
- 8.) Should the winner fail to claim the (prize) within ten days, or if he or she is deemed ineligible to receive the prize, the #2 ticket holder shall be deemed the winner and so on until the (prize) is claimed.
- 9.) The IRS has adopted the position that the \_\_\_\_\_ contribution is not deductible as a charitable donation for Federal Income Tax purposes. The winner of the prize is subject to any and all Federal and State income taxes and other taxes payable due to their acceptance of the prize.
- 10.) The liability of the (organization) and any persons, organization and business involved with this event for any other claim is limited to refund of the ticket contributions.
